

Summer Math- Incoming 4th Grade

Complete the online sample quiz that students in Texas take as an annual cumulative assessment at the Texas Education Agency's website:

We recommend completing the test online and submitting the answers to the site. Upon completion the students are given a compilation and analysis of results. These results identify areas of strength and weakness. If weaknesses are determined, then use the online workbook for those specific objectives. You will see that the online book is divided into "objectives." That way you can focus your child's attention on areas where he/she needs to improve. In the event that your child has a few areas of weakness, we recommend that you begin with one that he/she has exhibited moderate success so that he/she does not get discouraged. Work your way up to the areas where the most work is needed. Try to concentrate on one objective before moving to another.

Please keep in mind that the New Jersey standards that we follow at St. Catharine School are not exactly the same as Texas, but they are similar enough to use as a student guide to keep your child at or above grade level.
